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## CAMPGROUNDS-RANGES-LAKES • DP

Update: CK has found a turbidity curtain and submitter the specs to the Depart. Of Fish and Game for approval. Then the permits should be issued. Everything is in place to start the removal once the permits are complete. After they dry on the banks the debris will be removed.

- C. The tree trimming is ongoing at Four Island Lake. The crew works two days a week on this.
- D. A new sign is posted on the dam.
